Introduction

The Extractive Industry Transparency Initiative (EITI) is coalition between government, private sector, civil society, investors and international organizations. The EITI supports improved governance and accountability in resources rich countries through full publication & verification of company payment and government receipt from oil and gas and mining. With good governance, the exploitation of these resources can generate large revenues to foster Economic growth and reduce poverty, however when governance is weak, this resources may instead bring poverty, corruption and conflict.

Timor-Leste was admitted as candidate country on 22 February 2008 by fulfilling following requirements:

- 1) In 2003 Government announce its commitment to EITI by former Prime Minister Dr. Mari Alkatiri. With formation of the new government in 2007, Government continue its commitment to implement this initiative.
- 2) In 2006 Government committed to work with all Multi Stakeholders (Exp. Civil Society and Industry) on EITI, in the future will identify other relevant stakeholders to participate.
- 3) In 2006 Government announced and appointed EITI focal point / Coordinator, in 2011, current Government appointed a new National Coordinator through Secretary of State for Natural Resources.
- 4. In 2007 a Multi Stakeholder Group was formed and MSG meeting commenced. The MSG meetings are continuing.

By completing the 20 Indication Assessment Grid (IAG), Timor-Leste was designated as compliant country on 1 July 2010 The IAG included a requirement, where the MSG in consultation with EITI's key stakeholders should agree and publish fully updated workplan containing measureable target and time table for implementation. The workplan should also incorporate an assessment of capacity constraint and will need to be up dated annually.

Compliant countries including Timor-Leste, must mantain adherence in order to retain compliant status but where valid concern exist, where EITI implementation in Timor-Leste does not meet the required standar, then the board will suspend the status of the country and it will be required to perform new validation process or delist.

Since the completion of the first validation process in 2010, Timor-Leste has been admitted by the EITI International Standar in ranking as the 3rd in the world and the 1st in Asia Pacific.

By July 2011, EITI International Secretariat issued a new EITI Standard, which means Timor-Leste must comply with Requirement 1.4 in finalizing its annual workplan. In its effort to comply with Requirement 1.4, MSG revisited its objectives to ensure that it is linked to the EITI Principles and reflects Timor-Leste national priorities for the extractive industries.

The objectives listed within the work plan derive from five priorities below:

- 1. Encourage discussions on transparency in public expenditures, including investment decisions.
- 2. Maintain Contract transparency within extractive industry in Timor Leste
- 3. Encourage discussions on government's approach to economic diversification to reduce oil dependency
- 4. Continue to ensure institutional development for TL EITI secretariat
- 5. Reforming the legal framework within extractive industries and other revenue generate industries
